#### **Presenters**

Paul Pessis, Au.D., is the owner and director of North Shore Audio-Vestibular Lab in Highland Park, IL. In 2002, Paul received the American Academy of Audiology Presidential Honor Award for Services to the Academy. He is a founding member of the Illinois Academy of Audiology to which he served as the Annual Convention Co-Chair in 2001, Chair of the Ad Hoc Committee on Reimbursement and Vice-President of Legislative Affairs. He is the past Chair of the American Academy of Audiology Reimbursement Committee and currently serves on the Reimbursement Committee and is the chair of the RUC/CPT HCPAC subcommittee. Paul received his Au.D. in 2002 from Central Michigan University/Vanderbilt University. He teaches as an Adjunct instructor at the Pennsylvania College of Optometry. Paul has been published and has been a presenter/lecturer at numerous Academy meetings.

Alan Freint, M.D., is an otolaryngologist who is well known to the audiology community. For the past decade, Alan has lectured on medical and reimbursement issues at audiology State and National conventions. He has represented the profession of audiology at CMS hearings in an effort to bring direct access to audiologists. He, along with Paul Pessis, co-authored a book chapter on issues of reimbursement. Alan was recognized by the American Academy of Audiology with a Presidential award. The Academy of Dispensing Audiologists honored him with the Wernick Award for his dedication to the field of audiology.

Kadyn Williams, Au.D. joined forces in Atlanta with Helena Solodar in 1981 to form Occupational Noise Consultants (ONC), Inc., the first female-owned hearing conservation practice in Georgia. In 1983, they sold ONC, Inc., to a national concern and founded ACA in February, 1983, the first private audiology and speech pathology practice in Georgia. Dr. Williams is a fellow of the American Academy of Audiology and is a member of the Audiology Resource Association (ARA), the Academy of Dispensing Audiologists (ADA), the Georgia Speech and Hearing Association (GSHA), and the Georgia Academy of Audiology. Dr. Williams is an involved parent and highly accomplished and respected public speaker and educator. She was Editor of the Business Section of Feedback, the professional journal of the Academy of Dispensing Audiologists, for 4 years and has co-authored publications on hearing health care issues. She completed her Doctor of Audiology degree at the University of Florida in October of 2000.


