

# Why Demo?


- If done well, it can really impress your patient






- · Market survey results
  - 60% of professionals do not promote or do not even mention wireless accessories

    - 4/5 (80%) of them expected more information!!
- · Possible reasons for not mentioning wireless accessories
  - **Additional effort**
  - Lack of confidence in demonstrating

































#### How to demo Roger in your office

- · Use the following:
  - Set of Phonak hearing instruments programmed for the patient
  - ComPilot I or II (based on hearing instruments) with Roger X receiver (grouped or universal mode)
  - Roger Pen that is connected to Roger X receiver

# How to demo Roger in your office

- In Quiet:
  - Hold Roger Pen toward your mouth while talking and then turn away from your mouth to demonstrate the sensitivity of the microphone in Interview mode
  - Set Roger Pen on table and allow to go into Conference mic mode
- In Noise:
  - Turn on 'Party Noise' from Phonak software through desktop speakers and point Roger pen toward your mouth while talking and then turn away from your mouth to demonstrate interview mode.
  - Try clipping Roger Pen to included lanyard to demonstrate Lanyard mode which will create the most impressive SNR for the patient.

# How to demo Roger in your office

- Play multimedia for the patient
  - Use micro- usb audio cable to plug Roger directly into your media device
  - Stream music to the patient using a Compilot I or II with a Roger X receiver inserted into the europlug port on the base of the Compilot.





